Know where to take your child

Use the following information to determine which care setting is most appropriate for your child.

Primary care

- Best place for regular care
- When you have questions about your child's health, call his primary care doctor
- Visit during weekdays and by appointment for:
 - Well-child checkups
 - Physicals
 - Flu shots and other vaccines
 - Common illnesses and minor injuries

Urgent Care Center

- When your pediatrician isn't available
- For minor injuries and illnesses
- Open when your primary care doctor's office may be closed, including evenings, weekends and holidays
- No appointment needed

Emergency Department

- For serious injuries or illnesses
- Open 24 hours a day, seven days a week
- No appointment needed

If you think your child's illness or injury is life-threatening, call 911.

To help you decide if your child needs urgent care or emergency services, use the chart to the right.

- 1. Find your child's condition in the list to the right.
- 2. On the same line, find the **X** in one of the columns to the right of the condition.
- The X will show you if you should take your child to our Urgent Care Center or Emergency Department.


